#### INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Buff and Berger No. 6 Transit, with vertical arc, side telescope and Solar attachment.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined from observation of Polaris at its upper culmination when in the same vertical plane with the Star Delta of the Constellation Cassiopeia.

The distances were measured with 100 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

NOTE: The disagreements between these field notes and the location certificates as to courses and lengths of lines are due to errors in the latter.

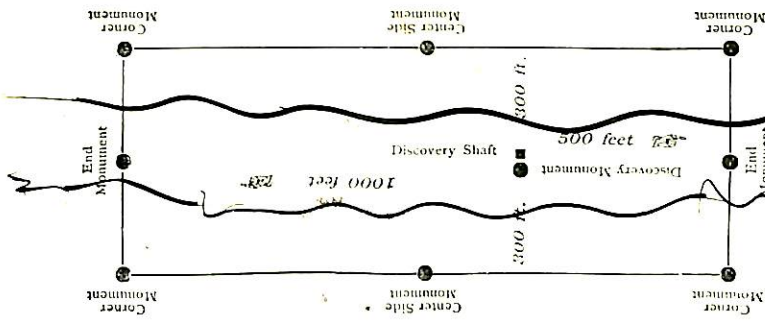

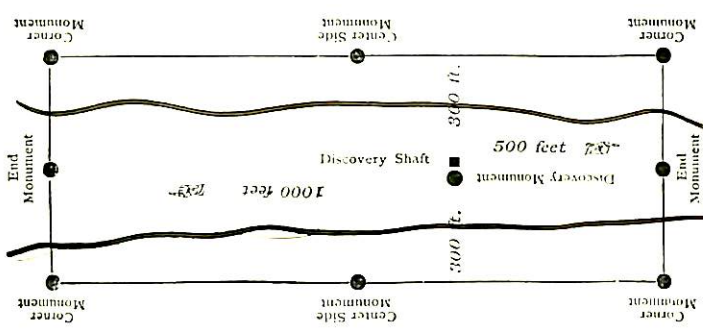

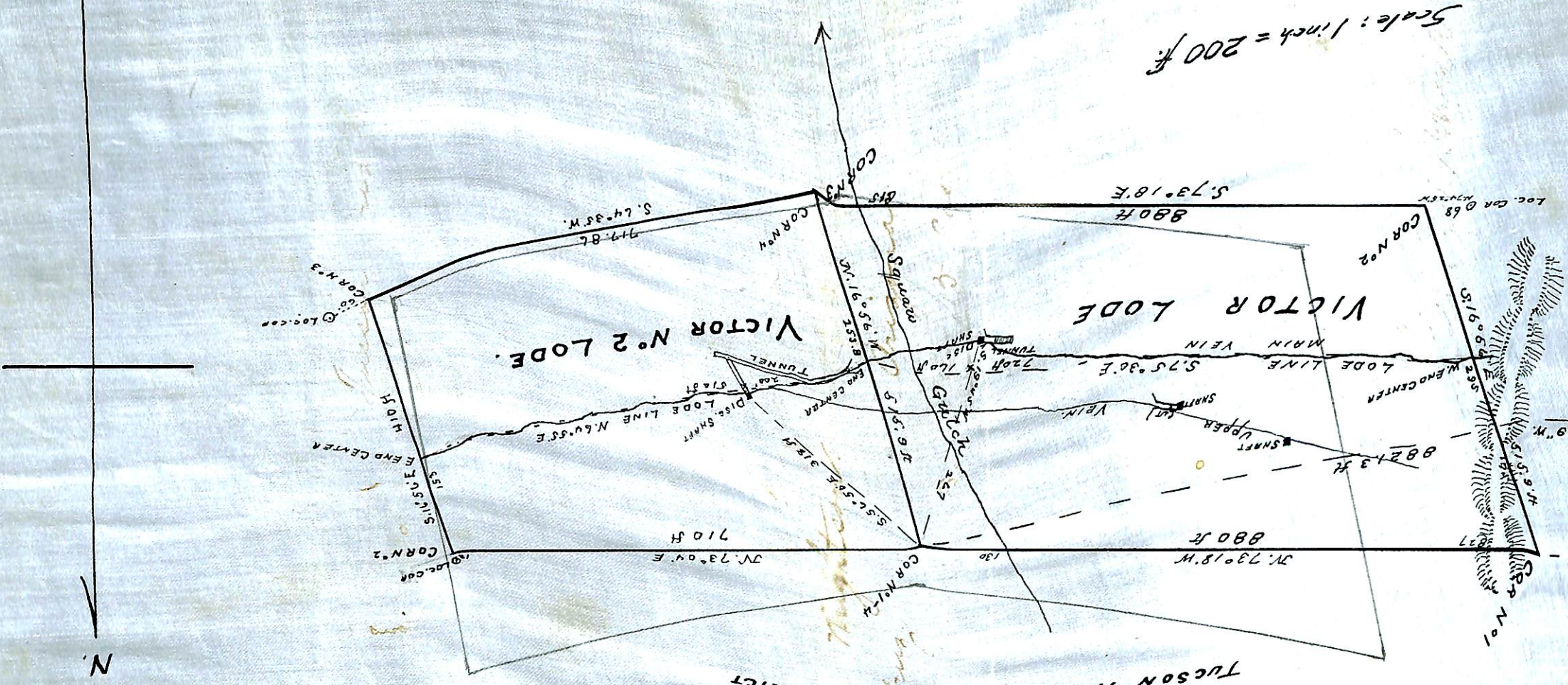

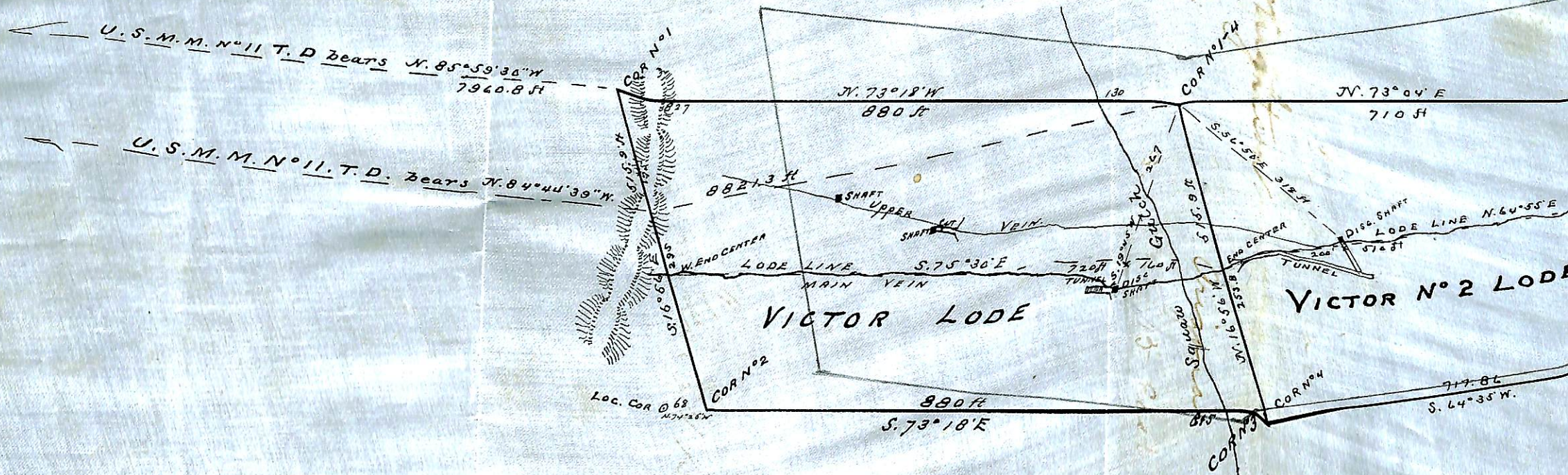
