NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION

Lode Claim.

To all whom it may concern:- This mining claim, the name of which is the Copper Link Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by G.O.Marrs, a citizen of the United States, over the age of twenty-one years, the undersigned, on the 11th day of September, 1900.


