This mining claim, the name of which is the Wayland Mining claim situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable minerable deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by Jacob Pirrung and Charley Strong the undersigned, on the 27 day of September 1899. The length of this claim is 1500 feet and we claim about 100 feet in a Northerly direction and 1400 feet in a southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode and deposit and premises is from the North W to the S.E. The claim is situated and located in the Warren Mining District, in Cochise county, in the Territory of Arizona, about 900 feet in a easterly direction from South Bisbee R.R. Siding. 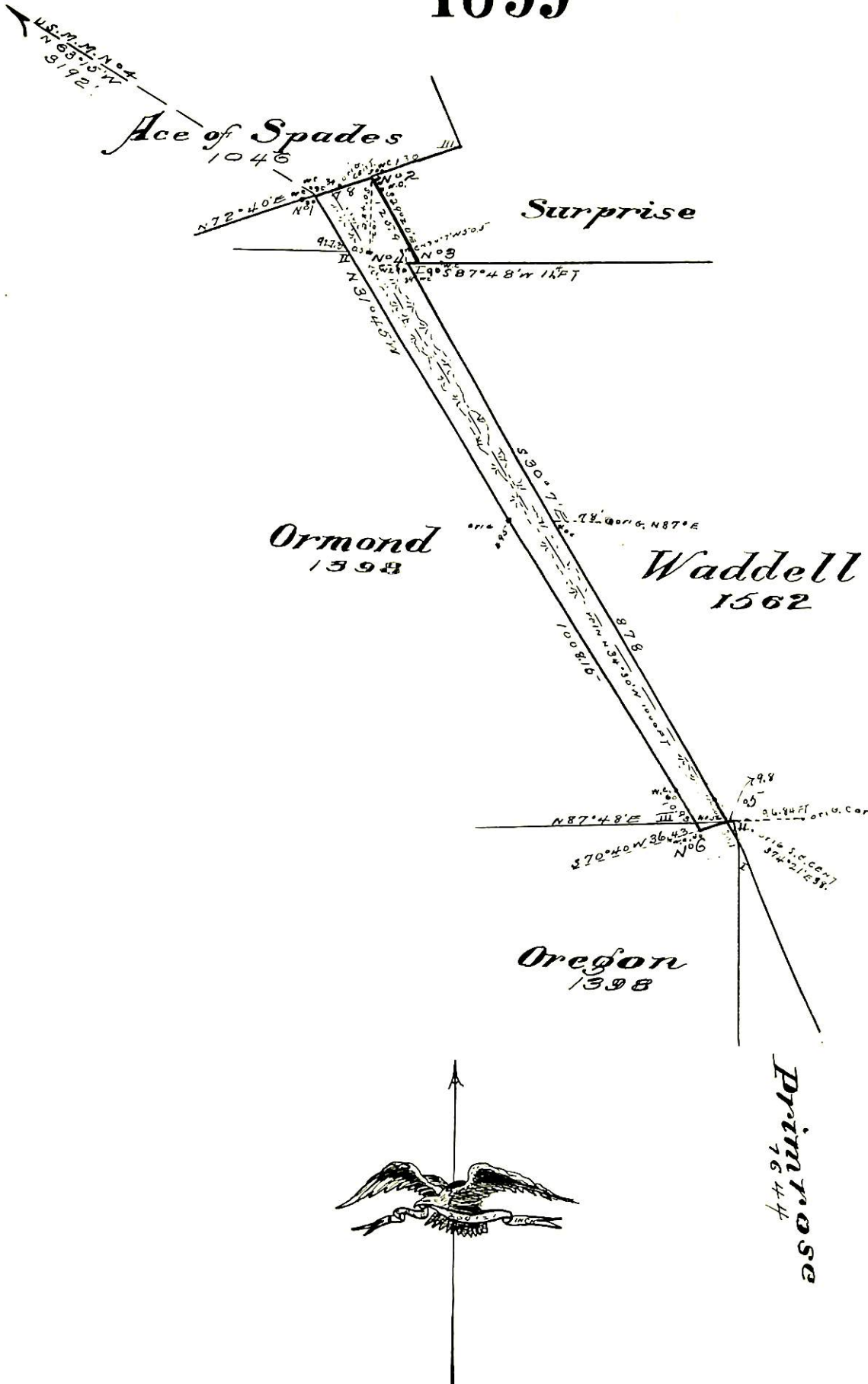
