This survey was made with a Gurley Mountain transit with solar attachment. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation. The distances were measured with 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

United States Location Monument No. 2.

On the south slope of mountain on the north side of Warm Springs cañon, about 500 feet north of the bottom of said cañon, and on a prominent ledge of rock that can be plainly seen from every direction, when there is no danger from snow, rock or land slides, or other natural causes.

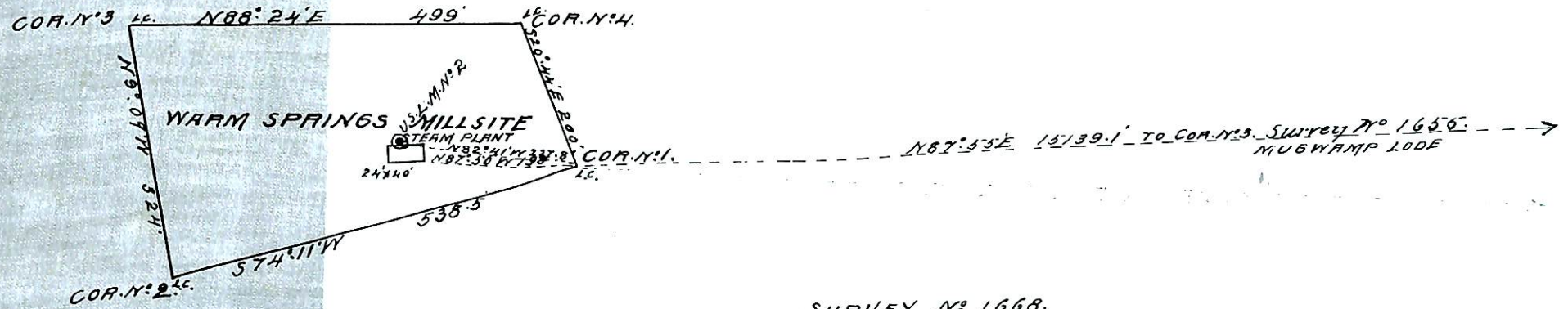
