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**Location.**

This claim is located in Turquoise Mining District, Cochise County, Arizona, on the East slope of the Dragoon Mountains, south of South Pass, in what will be, when surveyed, Tp. 19S., R. 24E. G. & S. R. B. & M. U. S. Loc. Mon. No. 1727 lies within the boundaries of the Eda Lode.

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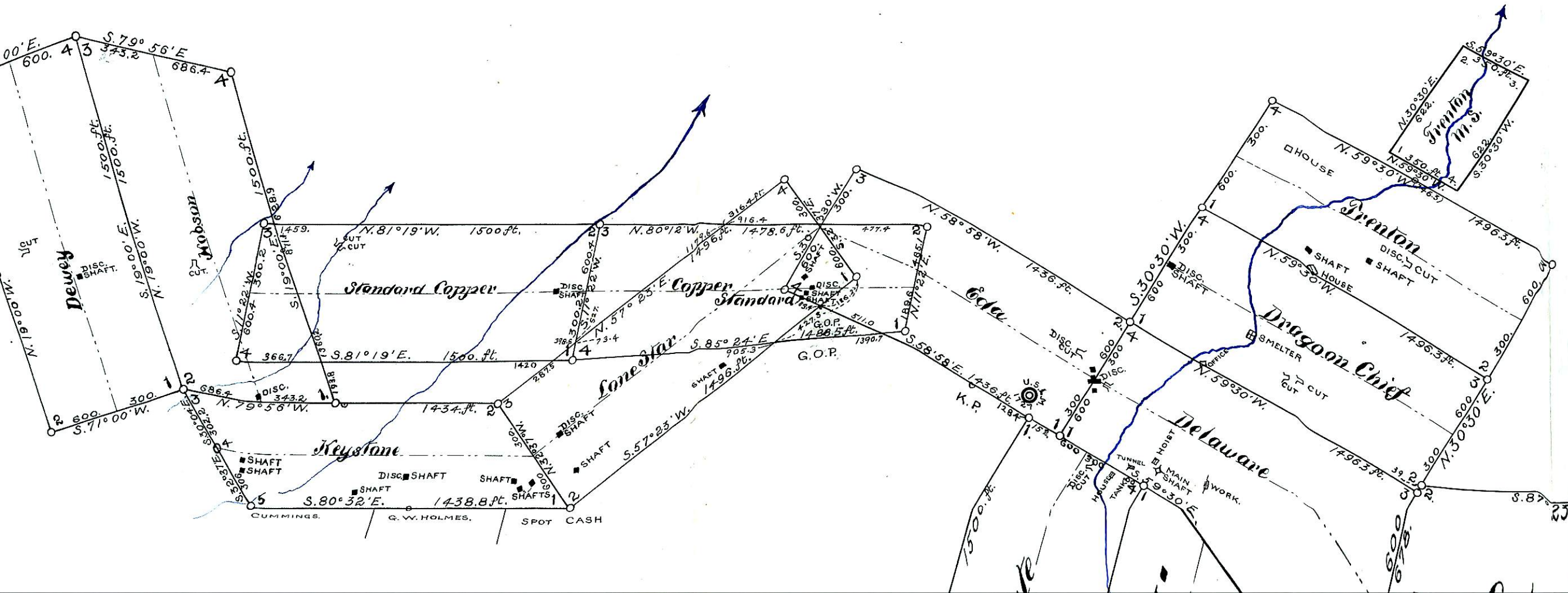




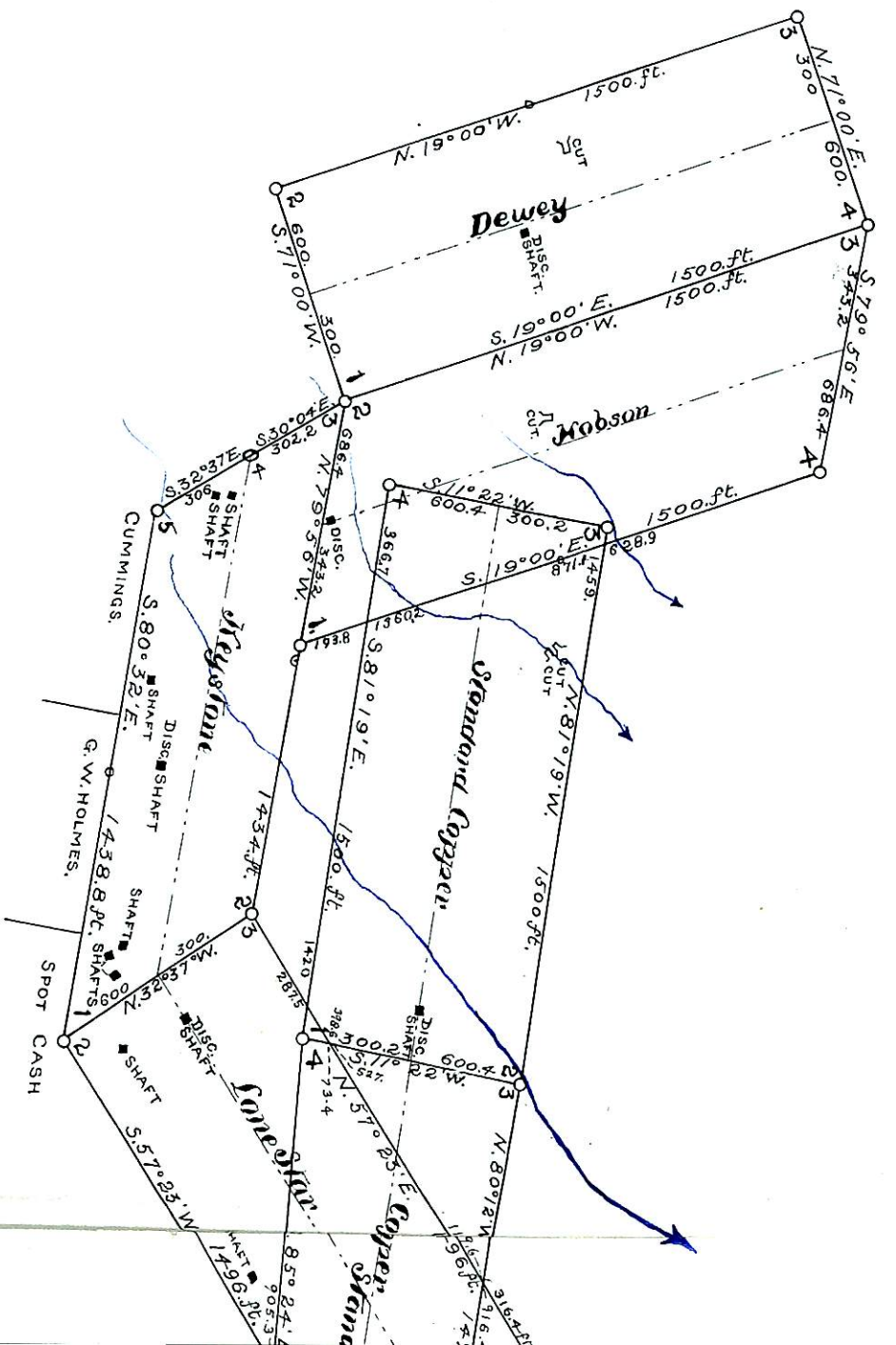


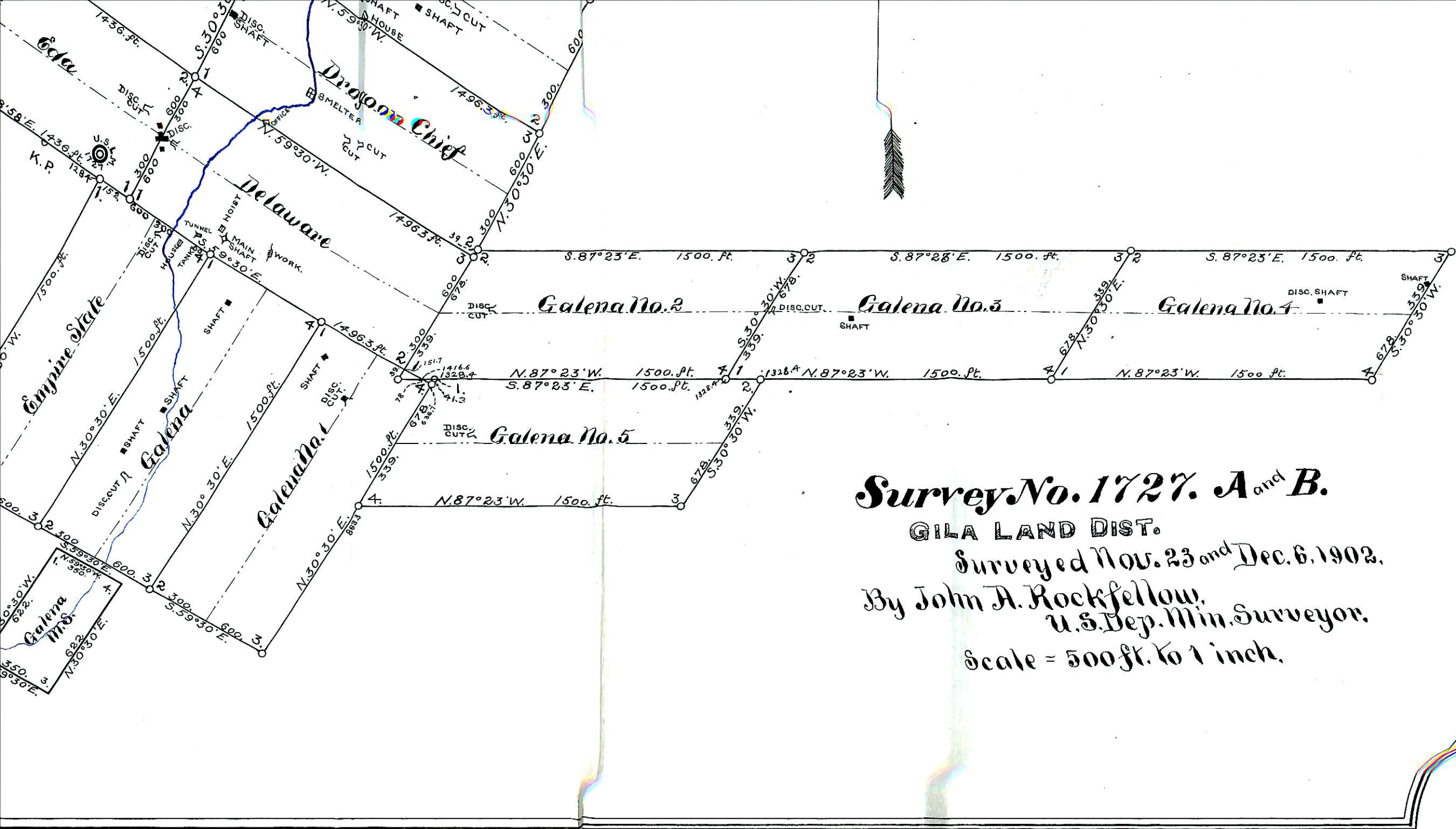


**Survey No. 172**
