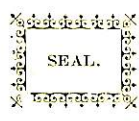

Notice of Mining Location.

To All Whom It May Concern:

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, having complied with all the requirements of Chapter 32, of Title 6, of the Revised Statutes of the United States, and the local mining laws, rules and regulations, has this day located fifteen hundred (1500) linear feet of this vein or lode; bearing precious metals, with all dips, spurs angles and variations, with surface grounds three hundred (300) feet on each side of the center of the vein, with all mineral deposits contained therein; and all timber growing within the limits of said claim, and all water and water privileges thereon or appurtenant thereto, under and according to the provisions of the United States mining laws, under which it is located.

This claim commences at this monument and notice placed upon the ledge and runs seven hundred and Fifty feet in a Easterly direction and seven hundred and fifty feet in a Westerly direction along the ledge.

The exterior boundaries are as follows, to-wit:

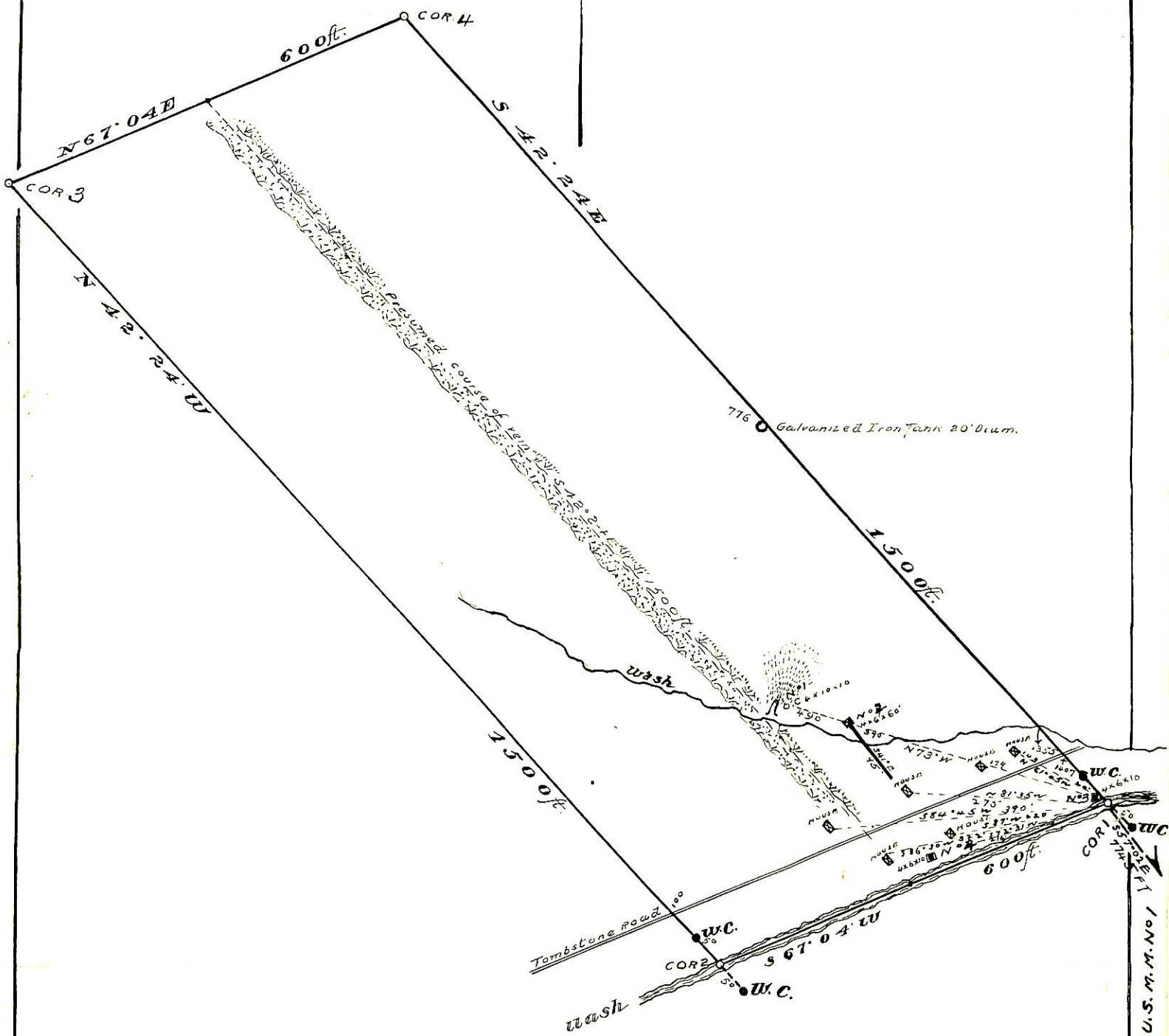
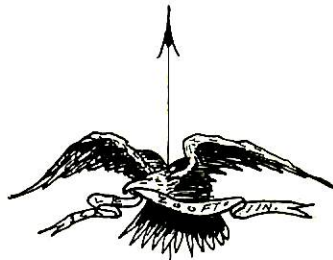
