Amended Notice of Mining Location.

Lode Claim.

To all whom it may concern: This mining claim, the name of which is the Jack Pot Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by H.G.Brown, the undersigned, on the fourth day of February, 1904.
