The discovery Shaft shows a vein of ore at 10 ft. depth, and is located from East end center, N. 50° 17' W. 433 ft.  
The presumed course of the vein is from the East end center to the West end center, a distance of 1422 ft.

This survey was made with a light mountain surveying transit, with solar attachment.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian, which was established at corner No. 1, by extending the westerly end line of the claim N. 17° 48' E. 117 ft. to an intersection with the south line of the Resalind lead claim. Survey No. 1623. Extended S. 59° 20' E. 529 ft. and making an angle with said line, to left, of 77° 08'. The said line of Resalind claim having been established by me by astronomical observations made on 15. 1902.

The distances were measured with a 100 ft steel tape.  
The disagreement between these field notes and the location certificate with regard to the location of the discovery shaft and the lengths of the boundary lines, is due to errors in the latter.

The mounds of stone around the corner posts, where not otherwise described are 4 ft diam at base, and 3 ft high, and the exact corner point is marked by a nail driven in top of post.

The general slope of the surface is to the Westward. The Goldstone lead claim forms upon the north. J. K. Murphy claimant. The Mammoth lead upon the east. Don. McNeil claimant. The Brooklyn Annex upon the south, owned by claimant hereto. The Jupiter lead upon the West. John Willcott claimant. all unsurveyed. Herbert R. Patrick. U. S. Deputy Min. Surveyor.

Amended Notice of Mining Location.  
Lode Claim.

To all whom it may concern: This mining claim, the name of which is the Brooklyn Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by J.A.Merrill, Sec'y for Black Rock Mining Co. acting for said Company, the undersigned, on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of July, 1904.

The length of this claim is fifteen hundred feet and I claim 400 feet in a southeasterly direction and 1100 feet in a northwesterly direction from the center of the discovery monument, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with three hundred feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the southeast to the northwest.
