develop the ore deposits of this district is to follow the example set by the Copper Queen Cons. Mining Co. the Calumet & Arizona Mining Co., the Lake Superior & Pittsburg Mining Co., and other proven mines of the camp namely, to seek a favorable central location for a main shaft, sink and develop the ground in depth with lateral drifts supplemented by raises and winzes. Shaft No.5 of the Late Acquisition lode of this survey was sunk for the following reasons: It is situated on a low limestone ridge about the center of the group, it is the only location on the limestone to which a suitable road ^{wagon} for transportation of supplies can be constructed without considerable expense. The limestone at this point shows fracturing and recementation, that is, disturbances have taken place which have loosened up the country and thus presumably made it more hospitable to the introduction of ore. Inasmuch as every foot obtained in depth is an approach to the level at which drifts may be run toward the edges of the group, in reasonable hope of encountering ore bodies, the shaft must justly be considered as tending to develop the entire group.






