REPORT

Under General Land Office Circular "N" of Sept. 23, 1882, upon the Placer Mining Claim known as the Home placer, claimed by E. I. Long, situate in Big Bug Mining District, Yavapai County, Arizona, embracing 19.8~~8~~³⁴ acres, approximately in T. 12 N. R. 1 E. G. & S. R. M.

HOME PLACER.

- a The soil embraced in this claim consists of auriferous sand and gravel, covered with a layer of loam and alluvium supporting a scant growth of grass and a few scattering trees of ash and walnut and oak brush.
- b The only creek passing through this claim is Big Bug, at this time a running stream 12 ft. wide with an average depth of 3 ins. This stream goes dry in midsummer and during the rainy seasons is a raging torrent.
- c The surface and underground workings on this claim consist of :
- Shaft 4x6 ft. 10 ft. deep, which hrs. from cor. No.1, E. 233 ft.
- Well with wind-mill and pipe line to cement tank, which hrs. from cor. No.4, S.41° 30' W. 289 ft.
- Ditch 12x12 ins. 1500 ft. long on east side of claim.
- d The nearest post office to the claim is Mayer, a mining town of about 500 population, located on Big Bug creek about one mile south west of claim, there is also a railroad station at Mayer, on the P. & E.R.R.
- e There are no lode deposits near this claim, the nearest being at Hackburry about 2 miles west.
- f This claim is well adapted for placer-mining purposes, water from Big Bug creek can be taken on to the highest part of the claim, in sufficient quantity for sluice mining
- g There are no mines, salt licks, salt springs, or mill seats upon this claim.

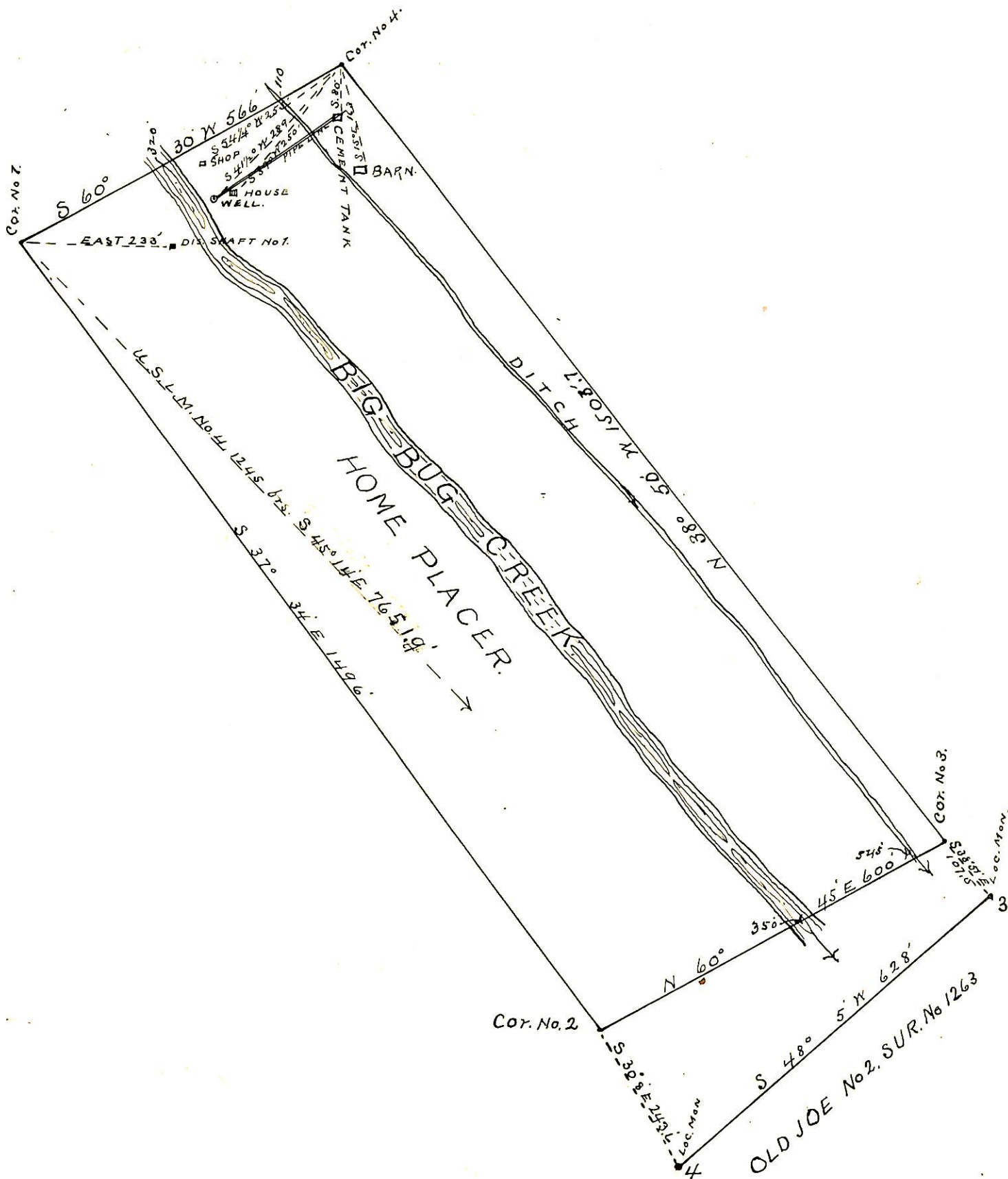
