The disagreements between these field notes and boundaries of other lodes of record are due to errors in the latter. I checked my courses and all lines describing boundaries of other lode claims were run from corner to corner.



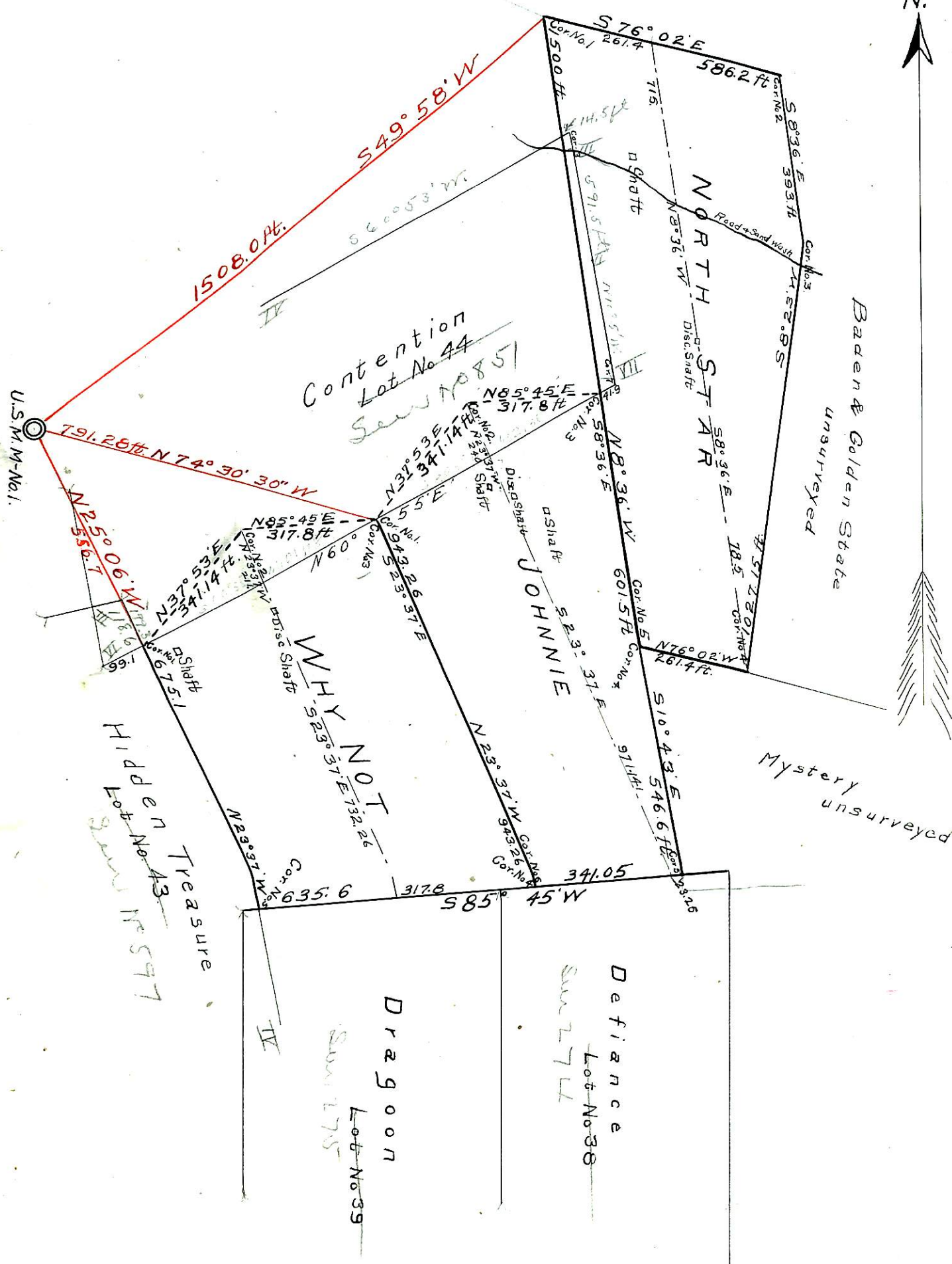
