AREA.

The new area of the Belle of the South lode claim is 20.66 acres. There are no conflicts.

ADJOINING CLAIMS.

Adjoining this claim on the South is the Nabel Claim, John Dobler and James Patton claimants. On the North, East and West is Public Land.

LEDGE.

The ledge bears from the discovery N. 00 15' E. 740 ft. and S. 00 15' W. 740 ft.

I traced the Standard Line from the Standard 1/4 cor. of
 sec. 33 T. 9 N., R. 2 W. and found the sec. cor. of
 sec. 32 and 33 poorly established and poorly marked. The
 Standard 1/4 cor. of sec. 32 is well marked and well
 preserved, but the topography is in error as the field
 notes call for it on the West side of the West Fork of
 Castle Creek while it is actually on the East side of
 Castle Creek.

From this corner I ran West, Va. 13' 46" and at
 2600 ft. found a mound of stone that might have been
 the cor. of sec. 31 and 32, but was unable to identify it.
 I searched diligently, but found no corner. I also
 searched diligently for the Standard 1/4 cor. of sec. 31,
 but was unable to find it. Hence the tie to the Standard
 1/4 cor. sec. 32, T. 9 N., R. 2 W., G. & S. N. B. & M.
