NOTICE OF AMENDED MINING LOCATION

LODE CLAIM

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This mining claim, the name of which is the Little Mans Lode Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase, by Thomas Reynolds & A.
