Lode Claim.

To all whom it may concern:-

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Idaho Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by Isaac Stoddard the undersigned, on the first day of April 1902.

The length of this claim is fifteen hundred feet, and we claim fifteen hundred feet, in a northerly and southerly direction and south one thousand feet in a north five hundred feet direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet on each side of shaft feet in width of the surface grounds on each side of the center of said claim.

The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the North to the South.

The claim is situated and located in the aguafria Mining District in Yavapa County, in the Territory of Arizona, about one fourth mile in a in a souherly direction from Copper Mountain beginning at the discovery shaft.
