Instrument.

This survey was made with a Stackpole and Bro. transit No. 1269. The course was deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observation checked by an observation on Polaris. The measurements were made with a 100 ft. and a 300 ft. steel tape.

On the evening of Sept. 9th, 1906, at 7-45 P.M. I observe Polaris, and follow it to its eastern elongation and put in point on this line. On the morning of Sep. 10 th, I turn an angle of 1° 23' E. for true meridian and connect by transit line with line of survey.
