- "a" The soil embraced in this claim consists of decomposed lime and marble. The soil is very shallow and in many portions of the claim the bare marble is exposed for acres in extent. The marble and limestone are non-mineralized and the surface for the most part is covered with jackpines and scruboak. There is a scant growth of grass and much cactus on the ground.
- "b" There are no springs or streams of water on the claim nor buildings whatsoever.


