The measurements were made with a 300.ft. and a 100.ft. steel tape.

At 1-30 A. M. on the morning of Dec. 11th, 1906, I observe Polaris and follow it to Western elongation. I set point on this line, and at daylight I turn an angle of 1°26'R. for true meridian. With transit I connect this line with line of claims and check solar observation, which I find to be correct.
