place, being a X with three marks to the North and
three marks to the South.

The conflict shown by these notes between Survey No. 535
Copper Hill lode and Survey No. 846 Amador lode is not
recognized as existing in the notes of Survey No. 846.
The position in which I find the monuments of these
Surveys, however, makes the conflict as shown.

The disagreement between these notes and the notes of
Survey No. 535 Copper Hill lode, Survey No. 551
Defiance lode, Survey No. 846 Amador lode and Survey No.
1109 Lizzie lode, are due to errors in the latter.
