NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION
LODE CLAIM.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Gold Spring Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by J. D. Coplen a citizen of the United States, the undersigned, on the 19th day of November 1900.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and I claim 1000 feet, in a northwest direction and 500 feet, in a south east direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim.

The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the northwest to the southeast.

The claim is situated and located in the Globe Mining District, in Gila County, in the Territory of Arizona, about three fourth Mile in a north west direction from the Black Copper Mine and about one half mile northwest of the Inspiration Mining Company's Mill. The whole of this claim is relocated as abandoned and forfeited property.

The surface boundaries of the claim are marked upon the ground as follows: Beginning at at a point in a southeast direction 500 feet from the discovery shaft (at which this notice is posted,) being in the center of the south east end line of said claim; Thence southwest 300 feet to a monument, being the southeast corner of said claim; thence northwest 1500 feet to a monument being at the southwest corner of said claim; thence northeast 300 feet to a monument at the center of the northwest end of said claim; thence north-east 300 feet to a monument, being at the northwest corner of said claim; thence south east 1500 feet to a monument at the north east corner of said claim; thence southwest 300 feet to the place of beginning.

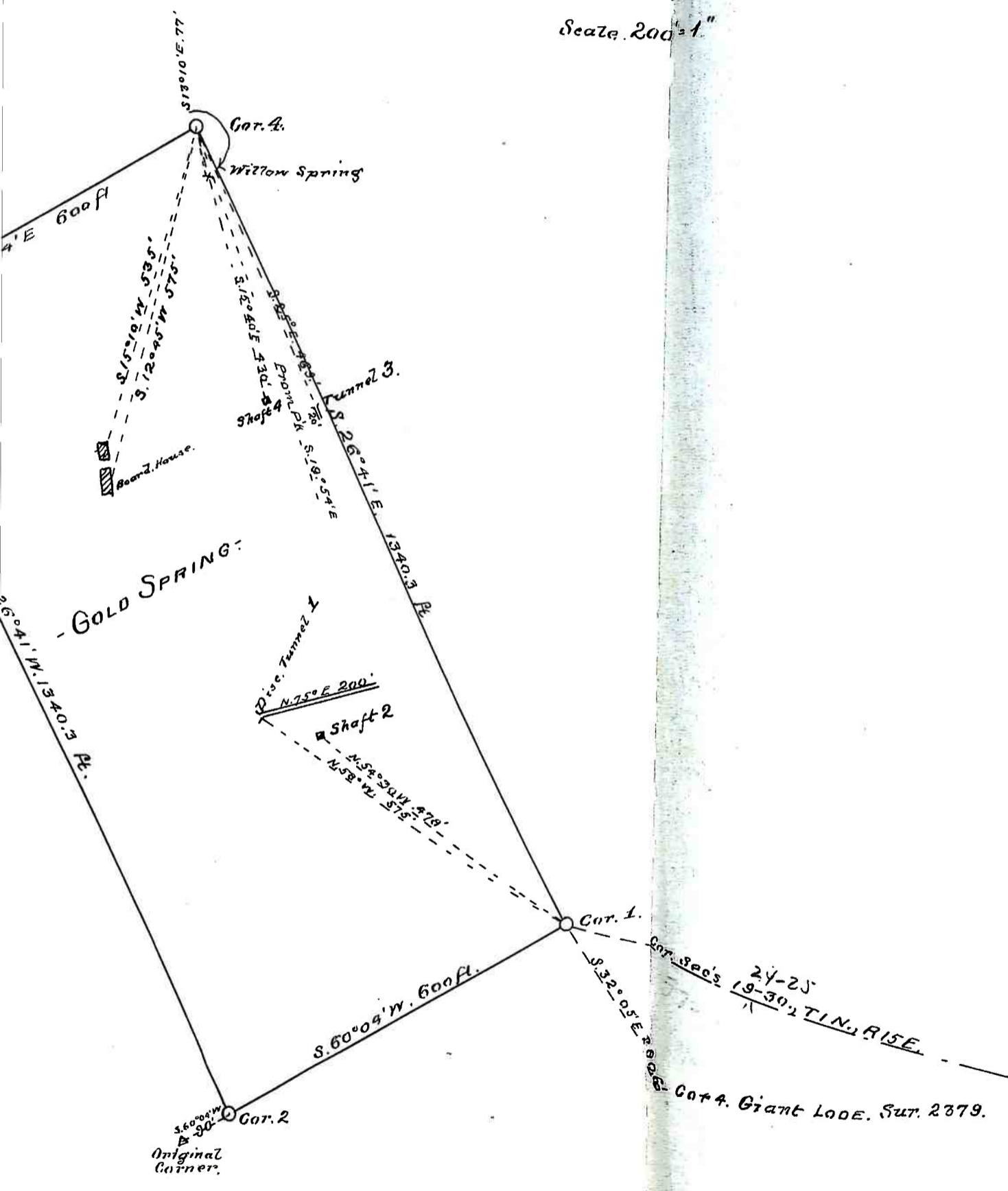
