
Dear Mr. Owens:

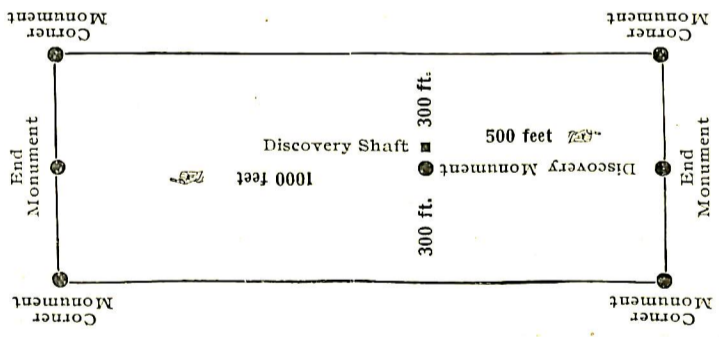



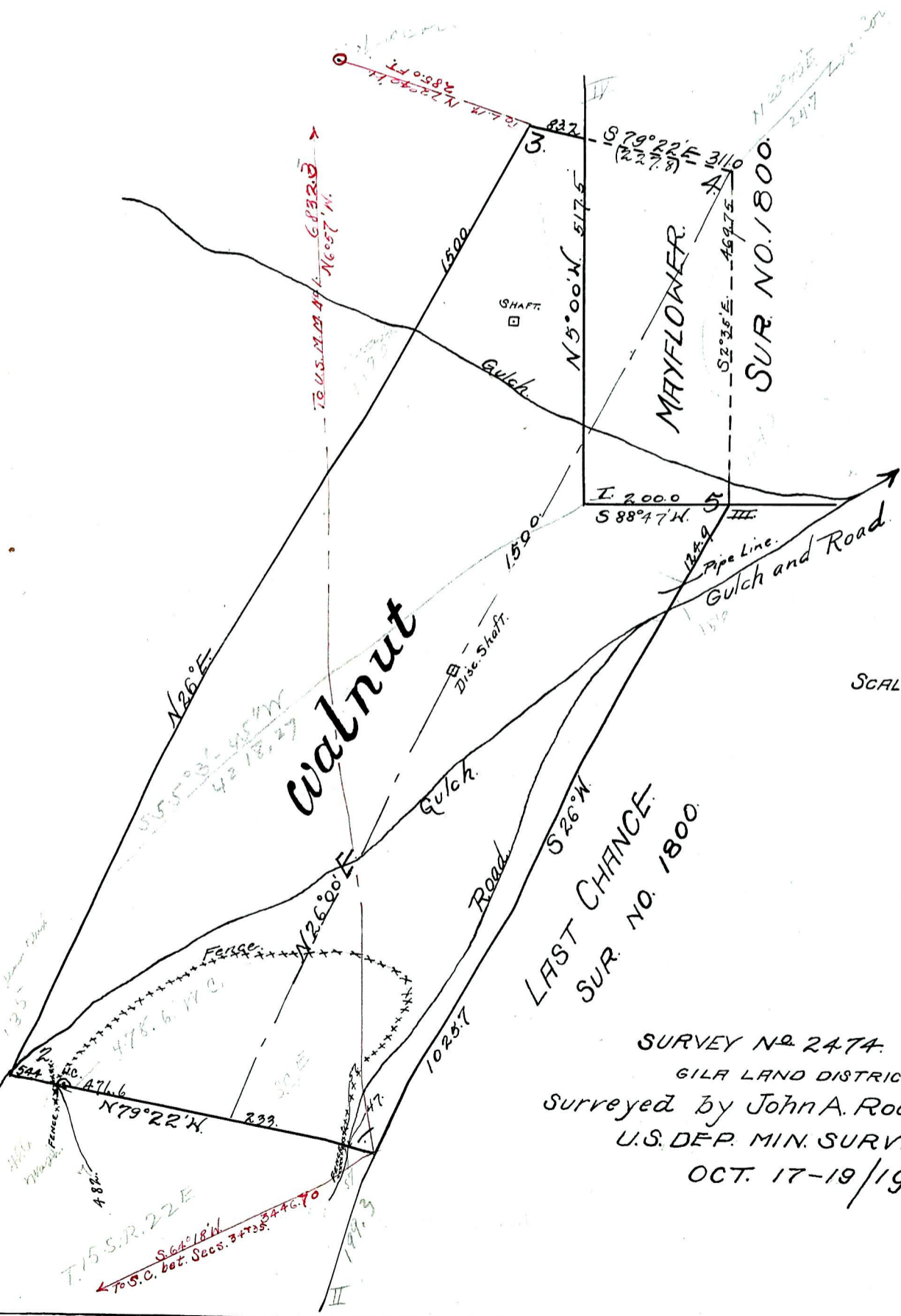
