The monuments of Sur.1638 which I found and identified are pine posts, 4 ins, square, set in monuments of stones, and scribed respectively; -2-1638; 1-1638; 2-4-1638; and 3-1638.

The disagreements between these notes and the location notices, and Sur.1638, are due to errors in the latter.

This claim is located ^{in Globe Mining District, Gila County, Arizona,} approximately in Secs. 1 & 12, T.1 N., R. 14 E., G. & S. R. Mer., Unsurveyed.

This Survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 300-ft. steel tape.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Rosaline No. 7 Mining Claim, containing mineral-bearing quartz, earth or rock in place, located by Alfred Kinney on this 20st. day of March 1896, has been located for mining purposes. Said claim is 1500 feet in length, and we claim 300 feet on each side of the center of discovery shaft, for full length of claim. The general course of this lode, deposit, or premises, is Northerly. This claim is situated in Globe Mining District, Gila County, Territory of Arizona, about 1 Mile in a northerly direction from Gold Hill about 2 1/2 Miles in a north westerly direction from the Lost Gulch Mill and about 7 Miles in a westerly direction from Globe.
