Supplemental Report to accompany field notes of The Honey Moon and Kid Lodes, Sur. No. 2543.

These claims are located approximately in the N. E. 1/4 of Sec. 12, Tp. 12 N., R. 1, E., ^{Unsurveyed} of the Gila and Salt

River Base and Meridian, in Prescott Forest Reserve

I tied these claims to U. S. L. M., No. 1694 for the reason that after a diligent search I was unable to locate any corner of the 3rd Standard Parallel North within two miles of the corner of Tps. 12 and 13 N., Range 1 and 2 E. The nearest known corner of said Parallel being six miles west, which is the Tp. cor. of Tps. 12 and 13 N., Rgs. 1 E. and 1 W. The country between these two points being very rough and mountainous.

I sat east of a mountain where I know the 3rd Standard Parallel North crosses about 15 miles to the west, and south of the calculated point for Tp. cor. 13 and 14 N., Ranges 1 and 2 E. I ran both east and west two miles and made diligent search for the section cors. but failed to find one. The Surveyor of the Forestry tried to find Tp. cors 12 and 13 N., Rg. 1 and 2 to tie some ranches to but was unable to locate same.

These claims are located more than 2 miles from subdivided public land and in order to tie the same to a sec. cor. of the 3rd Standard Parallel North it would be necessary to retrace 6 miles of said Parallel over a very rough and mountainous country.

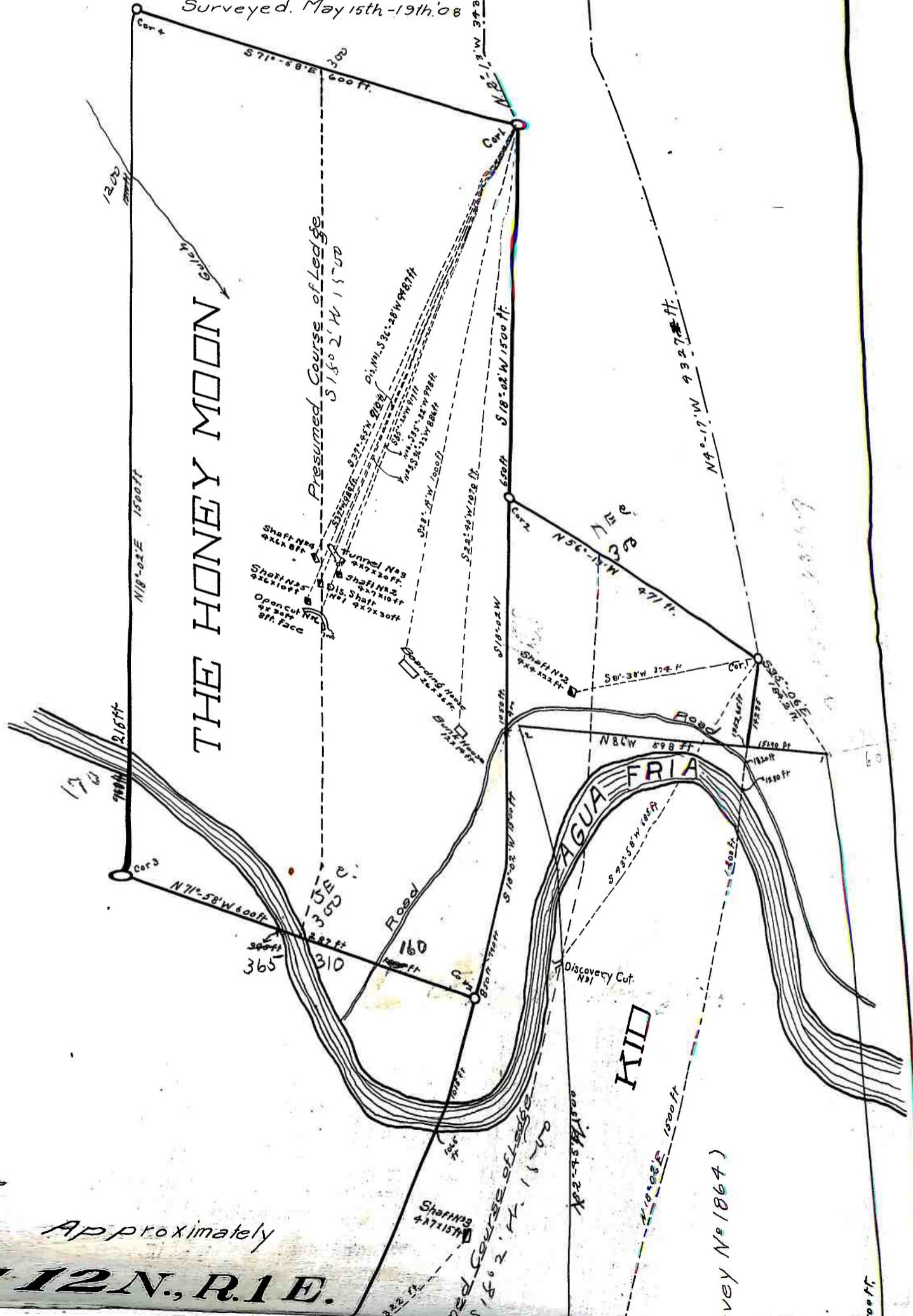
