These claims are located approximately in the S. E.
part of Sec. 1 Tp. 12 N., Rg. 1 ^{Unsurveyed,} E, _A of the Gila and Salt
River Base and Meridian, in Prescott Forest Reserve.
I tied these claims to U. S. L. M., No. 1694 for the
reason that after diligent search I was unable to lo-
cate any corner of the 3rd Standard Parallel North with-
in two miles of the corner of Tps. 12 and 13 N., Ranges
1 and 2 E. The nearest known corner of said Parallel
being six miles west, which is the Tp. cor. of Tps. 12
and 13 N., Rgs. 1 E. and 1 W. The country between these
two points being very rough and mountainous.

I sat east of a mountain where I know the 3rd Standard
Parallel North crosses about 15 miles to the west, and
south of the calculated point for Tp. cor. 13 and 14 N.,
Ranges 1 and 2 E. I ran both east and west two miles
and made diligent search for the section cors. but failed
to find one. The Surveyor for the Forestry tried to
find Tp. cors. 12 and 13 N., Rg. 1 and 2 to tie some
ranches to but was unable to locate same.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT OF IMPROVEMENTS

To accompany Field Notes of Fraction No. 3 Lode Mineral Survey No. 2548, executed by Park W. Latimer, U.S. Mineral Surveyor, now deceased

Having authority from the Surveyor General's Office for Arizona, by a letter dated Feb. 23, 1910, I wish to make the following report:-

I assisted Mr. Park W. Latimer in making the survey for Fraction No. 3 Lode Mineral Survey, No. 2548 Copper Queen Gold Mining Company, claimant, and have personally made a survey to locate the vertical shaft on the Little Ella lode Mineral Survey No. 1854, Copper Queen Gold Mining Company, claimant, with reference to a corner of Fraction No. 3 lode. Said vertical shaft hrs. from Cor. No. 2 of Fraction No. 3 lode, N. 50°-00' E. 282 feet. At the time of the survey said shaft was filled with water to within 20 feet of the level of the cross cut tunnel, shown on accompanying plat. The collar of this vertical shaft is 80 ft. above the tunnel level. I am informed by reliable sources that the bottom of this shaft is 270 feet below the tunnel level, and that from the bottom of this shaft a cross cut is run in a westerly direction 129 feet. 

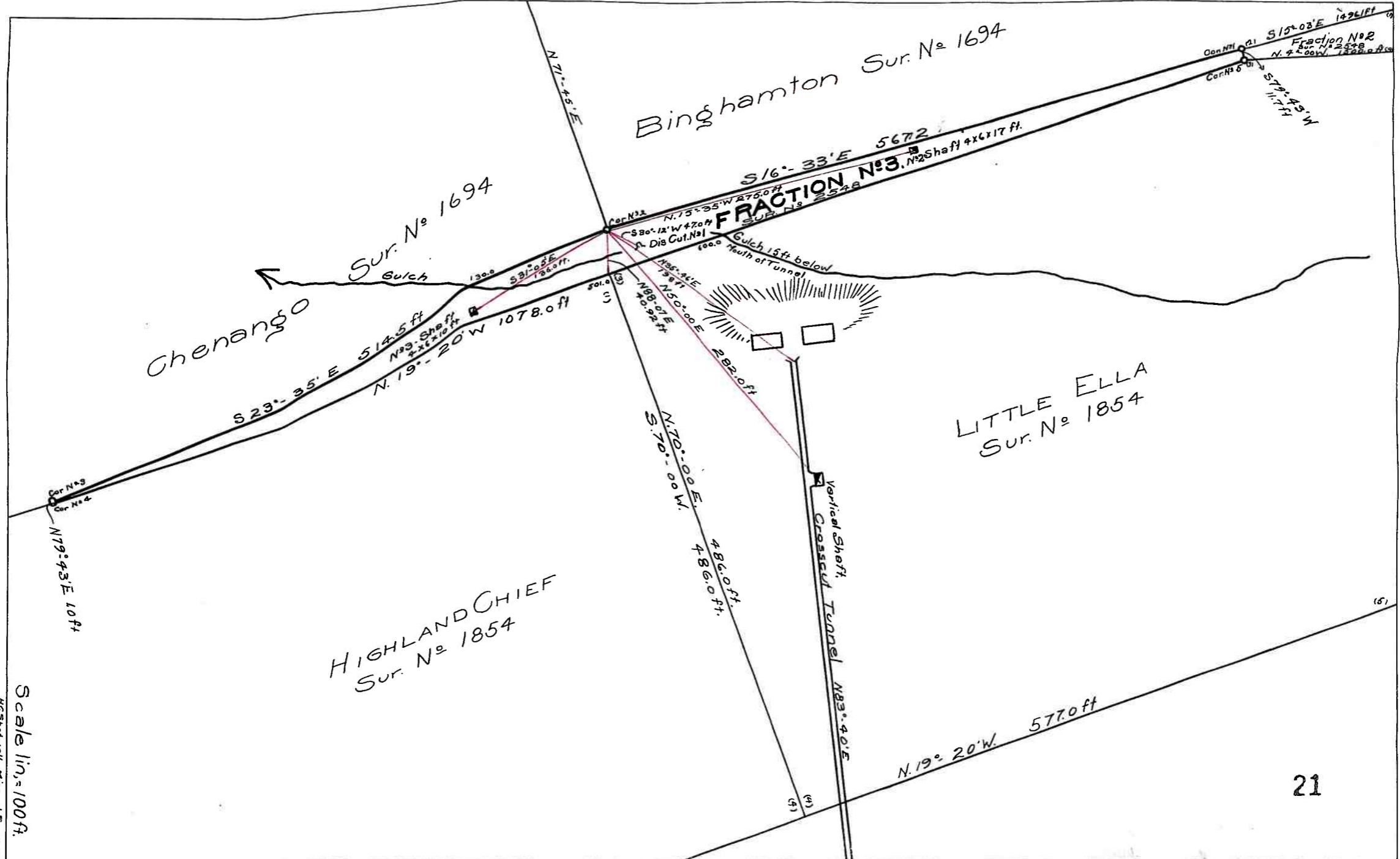
