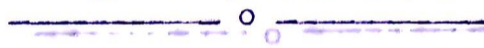

#### DISTRIBUTION OF LABOR AND IMPROVEMENTS.

The value of the labor and improvements upon the Sunshine lode is a common improvement for the benefit of the Sunshine and Sunshine No.2 lodes. All of the shafts upon the Sunshine lode incline to the southwest at an angle of 38° from the horizontal. The surface ground of the Sunshine No.2 lode is from 200 ft. at the southeast end of the location to 800 ft. at the northwest end of the loc-

ation higher in elevation above the said shafts and tunnel. Therefore all of the said improvements on the Sunshine lode drains the ground of the Sunshine No.2 lode and should be equally divided between those locations.

ADJOINING CLAIMS.

The claims adjoining this survey are the Hackberry No. 2 on the northwest end of the Sunshine lode, unsurveyed, W. B. Ridenour, claimant.

Lot No.37, Hackberry South lode, on the southeast end of Sunshine lode, W. L. Kayser and W. K. Ridenour, claimants. There are no other adjoining claims.

INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Buff and Berger Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined from direct solar observation and observation on Polaris. The distances were measured with a 50-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

Note- I find the following errors in former approved surveys. Line "XIII"- "X" Lot No.37, Hackberry South lode, N. 48°48' E. 9.154 chains, instead of N. 50° E. 9.08 chains. The tie line from Cor."X" to U. S. M. M. <sup>no 1</sup> bears S. 49° 20' 10" E. 2.61 chains instead of S. 50° E. 2.68 chains.

Note- I run west from corner common to Tps. 22 and 23 N. Rs. 13 & 14 W. three miles and the only corner I found on said line was the corner common to sec's 1-2-35-36. Tps. 22 and 23 N. R. 14 W., I found nothing more on said line that I could positively identify as being a U. S. survey corner. Therefore I could not tie the Sunshine and Sunshine No.2 lodes to a corner on said line.
