Reference to the map of this group accompanying these field notes will show that the claimant has inaugurated a systematic development of the group as a whole, from the seven points, viz: the two shafts on the Sun lode, one shaft each on the Hecla, Harvey and General Crant lodes and the Tunnel on the Mineral Zone and Era No. 3 lodes.
