I N S T R U M E N T

This survey was executed with a Young and Sons Light Mountain Transit No. 7520, provided with a horizontal limb reading to single minutes of arc. Bearings were deflected from the true North as determined by an observation on Polaris. Measurements were taken with a steel tape, graduated to feet, tenths, and hundredths.
