NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION

LODE CLAIM.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Rosaline No 10 Mining Claim situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by Clara Kinney a citizen of the United States the undersigned on the 6 day of May 1908.

The length of this claim is 1170 feet, and I claim 265 feet, in a northerly direction and 905 feet in a southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the north to the south.

The claim is situated and located in the Globe Mining District, in Gila County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 6 miles in a north westerly direction from Globe Ariz. and joins the Wedge, Goodenough and Starr claims.
