AMENDED
Notice of Mining Location
Lode Claim

To All Whom it May Concern:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Ochre Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by John Siess and G. Frank Harrington, citizens of the United States the undersigned, on the 25th day of November 1905

The length of this claim is fifteen hundred feet, and we claim nine hundred feet, in a northerly direction and six hundred feet in a southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with three hundred feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the north to the south

The claim is situated and located in the Tiger Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the Territory of Arizona, about three-quarters of a mile in a southerly direction from Oro Bella mill at Harrington P.O.
