This survey is located in the "San Francisco" Mining District, Mohave County, Arizona, approximately in T. 19N., R. 20 W., on unsurveyed lands of the U. S.

ADJOINING CLAIMS.

The Kansas Girl Lode, survey No. 2249, conflicts with this survey near corner No. 1. Area in conflict, .221 acres. The Hidden Treasure Annex lode claim, unsurveyed, J. L. Humble, claimant, lies on the south side near corner No. 2.
