it is the nearest corner that I could find; I could not find the N. E., S. E., S. W. and N. W. Cors., the 1/4 Cors. on the west and south boundaries, and the closing corners for fractional subdivisions of sections on the east and north boundaries of Sec. 31, as well as the 1/4 Cor. on the south boundary of Sec. 32.
