NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the ROSALINE NO.11 Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by Clara Kinney, a citizen of the United States, the undersigned, on the 4th day of April 1909.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet and I claim 300 feet in a westerly direction and 11 feet in an easterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the east to the west..
