This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit with Burt Solar Attachment; the courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by solar observation; the distances were measured with 100 and 500 ft steel tapes.

Report.

The side and end lines were run upon the ground and the corners established thereby; all the original location corners were in place, and consist of iron pipe marked with a number, set in the ground alongside of a substantial mound of stones, the key to the numbers being a map on file in the office of the Company.

The N.E. Corner of Sec 20, T8s. R22E. consists of a large monument of stones in which is placed a square stake marked with 3 notches on the south edge and 4 notches on the east edge; there is also a large stenciled sign board in the monument marked "Forest Reserve Corner".

So far as known there are no adjoining contiguous claims.

AMENDED NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.
LODE CLAIM

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

THIS Mining Claim, the name of which is the Little Puck Mining Claim situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by the Mascot Mining Claim, an Arizona Corporation, the under signed, on the 9th day of November, 1908.

The length of this claim is 1355 feet and we claim 230 feet, in a westerly direction, and 1125 feet in an easterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted lengthwise of the claim together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the west to the east.

The claim is situated and located in the Clark Mining District, in Graham County in the Territory of Arizona, about 600 yards in a westerly direction from the Gold Cord, Mine of the said Mascot Mining Company.

The surface boundaries of the claim are marked upon the ground as follows: Beginning at a Stone Monument at a point in a westerly direction 230 feet from the discovery shaft (at which this notice is posted), being in the center of the west end line of said claim; thence southerly 300 feet to a stone monument being the south west corner of said claim; thence Easterly 1500 feet to a stone monument, being at the North east corner of said claim; thence westerly 1500 feet to a stone monument at the north west corner of said claim; thence Southerly 300 feet to the place of beginning.
