#### INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Gurley Solar transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations. The distances were measured with a 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

I administered oaths to my assistants to save delay and expense.

Note:-

Sham Rock lode No. 2, 3 & 5 works are all in the same mineral deposit, the ground being considerable higher between these works, the surface descends slightly to No. 1 work on Fortune lode from which the surface rises to the South, this work is also in an ore deposit. By these common improvements the claim can be developed.

The common improvements, No. 1 on the Fortune and No. 5 on the Sham Rock lodes, are so situated that by being continued on their present course they will soon be two or three hundred feet under the surface, then by crosscuts and drifts, all the surface ore of every claim in this group can be extracted. Common improvement No. 2 Sham Rock lode, is an incline shaft, pitching towards the southeast. This, and No. 3 shaft on said lode are located near the center of the group and by sinking in these shafts, then by crosscuts and drifts the mine can be developed to great depth, and the ore extracted from each and every claim in this group with the greatest economy and convenience.


