VEINS.

I further certify that as far as can be determined from the present developments,the strike of the vein on the Enchanter No.2 claim is S.83°42'E.-767.0 feet and N.83°42'W.-733.0 feet along the center line of the claim measured from the center of the mouth of the discovery shaft, and the strike of the vein on the Enchanter #1 is S.74°57'E.-645.0 feet and N.74°57'W.-855.0 feet along the center line of the claim,measured from the center of the discovery tunnel.

The disagreement between these field notes and those of the approved survey of the Virginia lode,Min.Sur.No.2463 as regards the intersection 4-1 of the Virginia Lode with line 3-4 of the Red Jacket Lode,Min.Sur.No.1271,is due to an error in the approved notes of the Virginia Lode. It is given therein as 319.87 feet while I find it to be 318.63 feet from Cor.No.2 of the Red Jacket Lode. Min.Sur.No.1271.

I find a discrepancy existing between the location notice of the Enchanter No.2 and the claim as monumented upon the ground. The distance and course of the east center end as given in the location notice is S.25°42'E 210.0 feet from Cor.No.3 of the Red Jacket Lode,which is the location of the northeast corner. The location notice should have read S.25°42'E.-554.0 feet. This discrepancy is due to an error in the location notice.

INSTRUMENTS.

This survey was made with a Gurley Light Mountain Transit with a solar attachment. Distances were measured with 100 foot and 500 foot steel tapes. Courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined from direct solar observation checked by an observation on Polaris.
