 INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a Buff and Berger Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by Shattuck solar attachment. The distances were measured with a 100-ft. and 500-ft. steel tapes.

 REPORT.

The lode line of this location was run directly upon the ground, and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line. All tie lines were run either directly upon the ground or by traverses, run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.

The initial location monument of this claim is on the center line 300 ft. from the center of line 2-3, is a monument of stone, 3 ft. base, 3 ft. high.

Cor. No.3 and 4, Survey No.130, Flores lode, are pine posts, 4 ins. square, properly set and scribed.

I find the following errors ⁱⁿ said survey, line 3-4 S. 64° 53' W. 586.5 ft. instead of S. 64° 20' W. 595.5 ft. as given.

Note: The $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between Secs. 6 and 7, T. 22 N., R. 17 W., as also the corner to Secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12 and the $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. between Secs. 6 and 7, are nearer to this claim than is the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between Secs. 7 and 18, T. 22 N., R. 17 W., to which I have tied, but on account of the rough nature of the country between this claim and the $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. between Secs. 6 and 7, as well as the Cor. to Secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, and the fact that I was unable to find the $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. between Secs. 7 and 12, I have tied in my survey to the $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. between Secs. 7 and 18, as it is well established and well known in that part of the country.
