INSTRUMENT.

This survey was made with a light mountain Gurley transit.

The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by solar observation. The distances were measured with a 100 ft and a 300 ft steel tapes.

REPORT.

The lode line of this claim was run directly upon the ground and the several corners established by means of offsets from the lode line.

All the lines were run directly on the ground as was section line.

The $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between sections 20 and 21, Township 1 South., Range 14 East., G. & S R B & M. is a schist rock .4 x .7 x .8 ft out of the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the west side.

The corner common to sections 20, 21, 28, 29 is a schist rock .65 ft out of the ground .48 ft square on top and marked 1111 on the east side and 11 on the south side and 14 E on the west side.

The corners of the conflicting claims are redwood posts set firmly in the ground with mound of stones around them. Corner No 2 of the Congress lode is a stump of an oak tree 4" in diameter and 2.4 ft above ground.

Lines of conflicting claims were run out on the ground.

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Law Suit Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by Robert Pringle a citizen of the United States the undersigned, on the eighth day of October 1910.

The length of this claim is 1401.58 feet, and I claim 677.03 feet, in a N.70°04'E. direction and 724.55 feet in a S.70°04'W. direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Northeast to the Southwest.

The claim is situated and located in the Globe Mining District, in Gila County in the Territory of Arizona, about 16 miles in a South-westerly direction from The City of Globe and joins the patented claims Lily on the West and patented claim Congress on the North.
