upon the ground or by traverses, run upon the ground and
submitted in a separate report herewith.

Survey No. 2605, Spartan, Boston, Charleston and Era No. 2
lodes. All corners are pine posts properly set and scribed
with the number of the corner and survey, except cor. No. 4
Survey No. 2605 Era No. 2 lode, this cor. falls in Mineral
creek and had been washed away, its exact position was deter-
mined by course and distances from cor. No. 2 Survey No. 2605
Spartan lode, and from cor. No. 1 Survey No. 2605 Era No. 2 lode
as called for in the approved field notes of these claims.

The monuments on the W end line and S side line of the Copper Zone No. 1 lode are pine posts and were identified by the scribing with the names of the corners and the initials of the claim.
