The measurements of this survey were made with 100 and 500 foot steel tapes, with a W. & L. E. Gurley light mountain transit, unnumbered, having horizontal circle and vertical arc graduated to half degrees and reading by vernier to single minutes.

The natural course of development on this property as indicated by the topography - the west end of the Dallas lode being higher than the working outlets on Fort Worth lode, and the mineral bearing formation being apparently continuous through the two lodes

contemplates the extension of the workings above noted toward and into the Dallas lode of this survey and away from the El Paso lode.

Accordingly one-half of the above valuation is credited to Fort Worth lode, \$3362.50 and the remainder \$3362.50 is credited to the Dallas lode.

FIELD NOTES OF IMPROVEMENT NO.2.
