This survey was made with a Berger Engineers transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observation. The distances were measured with a 650 ft. steel tape.

The side and end lines of this claim and all tie lines were run direct upon the ground. The N.E.Cor. of T.1.N., R. 15 E., G.& S.R.B.& M., to which tie is given from Cor. No.1, is a quartzite stone, showing 5 x 7 x 9 ins. out of the ground, chiseled 1 N on south face; 2 N on north face; 15 E. on west face and four grooves on each face, with mound of stone alongside. The N.¼ corner of Section 2, T.1 N., R. 15½ E., G.& S.R.B.& M., unapproved, to which tie is given from Cor. No.1, is a quartzite stone 7 x 7 x 6 ins. out of the ground, chiseled ¼ on the north face, with mound of stone alongside.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the undersigned, Old Dominion Copper Mining and Smelting Company, a corporation, the owner of the Fame Mining Claim, situate in the Globe Mining District, Gila County, Territory of Arizona, the location notice of which ^{claim} is of record in the office of the Recorder of said County in Book 1, Records of Mines, at page 229, has on this 26 day of April, A.D. 1911, made an amended location of said mining claim, by virtue of which and of the location referred to in said notice it claims as a mining claim the following described lead, lode or vein of mineral-bearing earth, rock or quartz and premises situate in the Globe Mining District, in the County of Gila and Territory of Arizona, to-wit:

The name of said mining claim is FAME.

The name of the locator is Old Dominion Copper Mining and Smelting Company.
