All tie lines were run either directly upon the ground or by traverses, run upon the ground and submitted in a separate report herewith.

Note- The value of Shaft No. 1 of the San Francisco lode has been equally divided with the Golden State since it is directly used in the development of the latter claim, ### being on the same ledge and only twenty five feet E. of the E. end center. These two claims lie along the top of a high hill and the only accessible point from which they can both be most economically developed is from shaft No. 1 on the San Francisco lode.

A one half interest in shafts No. 3, 4 and 5 on the Gilbert House lode has been allotted to the Bullion claim since they are at practically the same elevation as the discovery cut on the latter and almost directly on the continuation of its lode line into the Gilbert House claim; any one of them would furnish the most accessible and economical method of developing both lodes from the most centrally located point with reference to each.

Survey No. 2489 Starlight and Torina lodes, All of the corners are granite stones properly set and ~~scribed~~ ^{chiseled} with the number of the corner and survey.

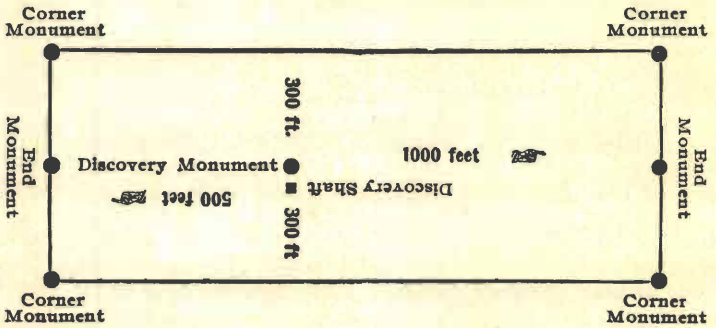
Sec. 2. Such location shall be made by erecting at or contiguous to the point of discovery a conspicuous monument of stones not less than three feet in height, or an upright post, securely fixed, projecting at least four feet above the ground, in which monument of stones or on which post there shall be posted a location notice which shall be signed by the name or names of the locator or locators.

Sec. 4. From the time of the location of a mining claim, as above specified, the locator shall be allowed ninety days within which to do or cause to be done the following things:

2. To sink a discovery shaft in the claim to a depth of at least eight feet from the lowest part of the rim of the shaft at the surface, and deeper, if necessary, until there is disclosed in said shaft mineral in place.

Sec. 6. Such surface boundaries shall be marked by six substantial posts projecting at least four feet above the surface of the ground, or by substantial stone monuments at least three feet high, to-wit: One at each corner of said claim and one at the center of each end-line thereof.

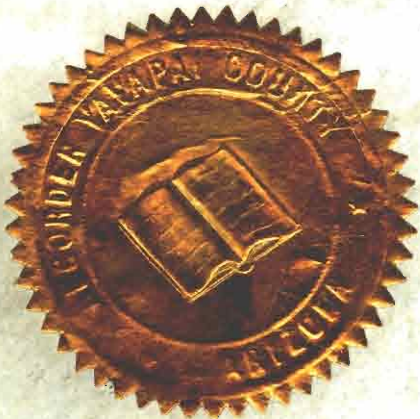
