To all Whom It May Concern:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the Falls Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by M. Jones & J. S. Sessions citizens of the United States the undersigned, on the 29 day of April, 1905

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and we claim 100 feet, in a southerly direction and 1400 feet in a northerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the north East to the South west.

The claim is situated and located in the Cherry Creek Mining District, in Yavapai County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 3 miles in a northerly direction from Post Office on Cherry Creek and is the First North Extention of the Leghorn mining and adjoining the Sitting Bull mine on the north side line.

The surface boundaries of the claim are marked upon the ground as follows: Beginning at a monument of stone at a point in a southerly direction 100 feet from the discovery shaft (at which this notice is posted), being in the center of the south end line of said claim; thence easterly 300 feet to a monument, being the South East corner of said claim; thence northerly 1500 feet to a monument, being at the northeast corner of said claim; thence westerly 300 feet to a monument at the center of the north end of said claim; thence westerly 300 feet to a monument, being at the north west corner of said claim; thence southerly 1500 feet to a monument at the South west corner of said claim; thence Easterly 300 feet to the place of beginning.
