## NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the CHULO VISTO Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits was entered upon and located for the purpose of exploration and purchase by Isaac N. Stevens and Julia Lezynskey United States citizens the undersigned, on the 1st day of January 1910.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet and we claim 600 feet in a East direction, and 900 feet in a West direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the East to the West

The claim is situated and located in the Greenlee Gold Mountain Mining District, in Graham County, in the Territory of Arizona, about one half mile in a North east direction from the foot of Longfellow Incline on the East side chase creek and is a Relocation of the Arizona Mining claim.
