On account of the amending of the Brownie lode of this survey subsequent to the execution of Sur. 2841, there is a difference between the conflict of the said Brownie lode with the Wild Air lode of said Sur. 2841, as given in these notes, and the conflict between these two claims as reported in the returns of Sur. 2841.

Cor. No.3, Geneva lode, Sur. 2627, is a 4 x 4 redwood post, as described herein.

The disagreement between these notes and the certificates of location is due to errors in said certificates.
