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Location.

This survey is located in the unsurveyed section 18, uns. T.1 N., R.15 E., G.& S.R.B.& M., Globe Mining District, Gila County, Arizona, in the Crook National Forest.

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Adjoining and Conflicting Claims.

The Raven No.6 lode, unsurveyed, owned by Wilson J. Rollins, and unknown claims, on the north. Unknown claims, on the east. The Severus Placer, unsurveyed, owned by L.C. Pearse et al. Warrior lode, Survey 2500; Santa Cruz and San Jose lodes, both of Survey 3015, owned by the claimant of the claims in this survey, on the south. And, the Raven No.4 lode, unsurveyed, owned by Wilson J. Rollins, on the west.

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Improvements.

I certify that the value of the labor and improvements, made upon or for the benefit of the San Diego lode, by the claimant or its grantors, is not less than five hundred dollars, and that the improvements on or for the benefit of each of the claims in this survey at the present time are as follows:

San Diego.

No.1, the discovery, shaft 4 x 6 x 34 ft., the center of which is on the lode line 55.5 ft. from the S.W. end center. Value \$340.00.

A one-fourth interest in Improvement No.3 of the San Jose lode of Sur. 3015, consisting of 140 ft. of cut and tunnel, 5.5 x 7.5 ft., the center of the mouth of which bears N.62°-35' W. 32.6 ft. from Cor. No.1 of said San Jose lode, and which extends thence N.61°-30' E. 97.0 ft.; thence N.22°-15' E. 43.0 ft. to face. Value \$1400.00.

This improvement is intended for the benefit of the San Jose, Santa Clara and Santa Cruz lodes of Sur. 3015 and the San Diego lode of this survey, all of said claims being owned by the claimant of this survey. The surface of these claims rises rapidly toward the northeast from the mouth of this improvement to such an extent that the face is well below the surface of each of the claims to which its value is distributed. The proposed scheme of development is to continue the tunnel in its present general direction and by laterals therefrom directed toward and under each of said claims to develop and mine them. The plan of developing and mining the four claims from this tunnel being a feasible one, consistent with good mining, the value of the improvement is distributed equally to each of said claims, one fourth, being credited to each. Value credited to the San Diego lode, \$350.00.

No portion of the value of this improvement is credited to the San Benito lode of this survey on account of its having been located subsequent to the making of the same.

San Benito.

No.1, the discovery, 29 ft. of cut and tunnel, 4 x 6 ft., the center of the mouth of which is on the lode line, 346.0 ft. from the North west end center, and which extends thence S.85° W. to face. Value \$120.00.

No.2, cut, 4 x 10 x 15 ft., the center of the mouth of which bears N.54°-40' W.374.30 ft. from a point on the lode line 862.0 ft. from the S.E.end center and which extends thence S.88°W to face. Value \$35.00.

No.3, shaft, 4 x 6 x 23 ft., partially timbered, the S.W.Corner of which bears N.28°-55' E. 206.6 ft. from the above described point. Value \$200.00

At the present time, the value of the improvements on this claim are not of the value of Five hundred dollars. Prior to the expiration of the period of publication of the claimants notice of application for patent I will submit report of additional work to be performed.

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Other Improvements.

San Diego.

A cut 4.5 x 10 x 14 ft., the center of the mouth of which bears S.04°-45' W.80.4 ft. from Cor. No.3, and which extends thence N.75° E. to face.

The value of this improvement is not credited to this claim because of its not having made by the claimant or its grantors.

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Instrument and Determination of Meridian.

This survey was made with a 6¼ inch Berger Engineer's Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observation, verified by Polaris observation. The distancies were measured with a 650 ft. steel tape.

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Report.

The side and end lines of the claims in this survey and all tie lines were run direct upon the ground.

The North Quarter Corner of Section 19, T.1 N., R.15 E., G.& S.R.B.& M., to which tie is given, is a quartzite stone 6 x 6 x 6 inches out of the ground, with mound of stone alongside, chiseled $\frac{1}{4}$ on east face.

Survey No.2500, Warrior lode:

Corners 2 and 3 are 4 x 4 posts properly set and scribed. The disagreement between these notes and line 2-3, of said Warrior lode, as approved, is due to error in said Survey 2500.

Survey No.3015, Santa Cruz and San Jose lodes:

Corners 3 and 4, Santa Cruz and Cor. No.4, San Jose lode, are 4 x 4 posts properly set and scribed. Cor. No. 3, San Jose lode, is a 3 in. iron pipe, set in concrete, properly marked. I find line 3-4, of said Santa Cruz lode and line 3-4, of said San Jose lode, correct as approved.

Raven No.4 and Raven No.6 lodes, unsurveyed:

The south west and south east corners of said Raven No. 4 lode and the south east and south west corners of said Raven No.6 lode, are 4 x 4 posts set in the ground, with mounds of stone.
