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Location.

This survey is located on unsurveyed land in what will

probably be, when surveyed, Sections 25 and 36, T.1 N., R.14 E., G. & S.R.B. & M., in Globe Mining District, Gila County, Arizona, partially in the Crook National Forest.

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Adjoining and Conflicting Claims.

The Wedge and Copper Glance lodes, of Survey 3033, owned by the claimant of this survey, on the north. The Lawful Ledge lode, Survey 2819, owned by the New Keystone Copper Company, on the east. The Golden Wonder lode, unsurveyed, owned by Mrs. L.C. Woods, et al., on the south. And the Copper Bullion lode, unsurveyed, owned by William Phillips, et al., on the west.

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Improvements.

No.1, the discovery, 37 ft. of cut and tunnel, 3.5 x 6 ft., which is intersected by the lode line, 49.70 ft. from the Northeast end center, and which extends thence N.25°-30' E. 30.0 ft. to face and S.25°-30' W. 7.0 ft. to mouth. Value \$160.00.

At the present time the labor and improvements made upon this claim by the claimant or its grantors is not sufficient to make the value thereof Five Hundred Dollars. Prior to the expiration of the period of publication of notice of the claimants application for patent, I will submit report of additional improvements to be made.

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Other Improvements.

A cut, 4 x 6 x 16 ft., the center of the mouth of which bears N.21°-26' E. 402.50 ft. from Cor. No.2, and which extends thence N.35° E. to face.

86.5 ft. of cut and tunnel, 4 x 6 ft., the center of the mouth of which bears N.28°-26' E. 369.7 ft. from Cor. No.2 and which extends thence N.21°-30' E. 30.0 ft.; thence N.31°E 56.50 ft. to face.

The value of these two improvements is not credited to this claim, because of them not having been made by the

claimant or its grantors.

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Instrument and Determination of Meridian.

This survey was made with a 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ inch Berger Engineer's Transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct Solar observation, verified by Polaris observation. The distances were measured with a 650 ft. steel tape.

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Report.

The side and end lines of this claim and all tie lines were run direct upon the ground.

The corner common to Sections 30 and 31, on the west boundary of T.1 N., R. 15 E., G. & S.R.B. & M., to which tie is given is a schist stone .4 x .7 x 1.3 ft., out of the ground, marked with one groove on the south face, five grooves on the north face and 15 E on the west face.

Survey No. 2819, Lawful Ledge lode:

Corners 2 and 3 are 4 x 4 posts properly set and scribed. The disagreement between these notes and the length of line 2-3, of said Lawful Ledge lode, as approved, is due to error in said Survey 2819.

Survey No. 3033, Wedge and Copper Glance lodes:

I find line 1-2, the Section corner tie and the bearing of line 4-1, of Wedge lode; and the bearing of lines 1-2-3, Copper Glance lode, correct as approved.

The disagreement between these notes and the notice of location is due to error in the latter.

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the COPPER GLANCE FRACTION Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by The Inspiration Consolidated Copper Co., the undersigned, on the 24 day of December, 1912.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet and we claim 59.2 feet in a north easterly direction and 1440.8 feet in a south westerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 147.6 feet on the n'th side and 300 feet on the south ~~feet-in-width-of-the-surface-grounds-on-each-~~ side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the north east to the south west.

The claim is situated and located in the Globe Mining District, in Gila County, in the State of Arizona, about 1½ miles in a westerly direction from the town of Miami.


