The four lodese embraced in this claim comprise one contiguous group, which can be advantageously developed, owing to the natural topography of the country from the four workings on the King Edward lode, as will be seen upon inspection of the accompanying map

marked contour map. Sur. No. 3077 which is a part of these field notes. The contours were taken from the U. S. G. S. topographic sheet of the Clifton quadrangle.

No's 2 and 4 tunnels on the King Edward lode if continued will develop the veins on the King Edward No. 1, King Edward No. 2 and King Edward No. 3 lodes at a depth of 600 ft. and 500 ft. respectively, there being a difference of 100 ft. in elevation between the tunnels.

If the No's 3 and 5 shaft are continued drift can be driven to develop the veins of all the lodes embraced in this claim at a greater depth.

These workings are situated advantageously for transporting the ore, as the only means of egress is via Placer Gulch to Metcalf, which is about two miles to the Southwest, thence via the Coronado Railway to the smelters at Clifton, so it is self evident that the four workings on the King Edward lode are common improvements for all the lodes embraced in this claim.

#### I N S T R U M E N T .

This survey was made with a Buff and Berger light mountain mining transit. The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by Polaris observations. The distances were measured with 5 ft., 50 ft. and 500 ft. steel tapes.

## R E P O R T .

After a thorough search I fail to find any corners of the public land surveys within two miles of this survey.

U. S. L. M. No. 2. is a pine post 6 ins. square 7 ft. high properly set and scribed.

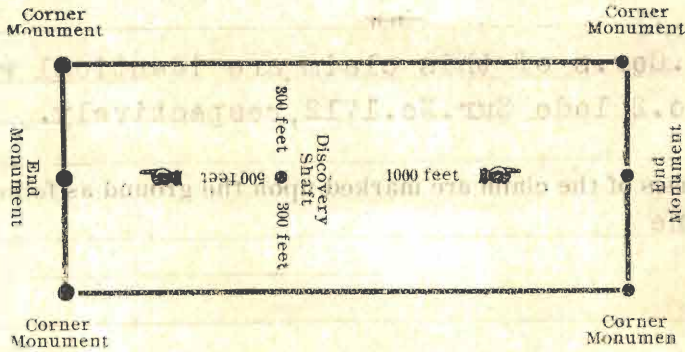

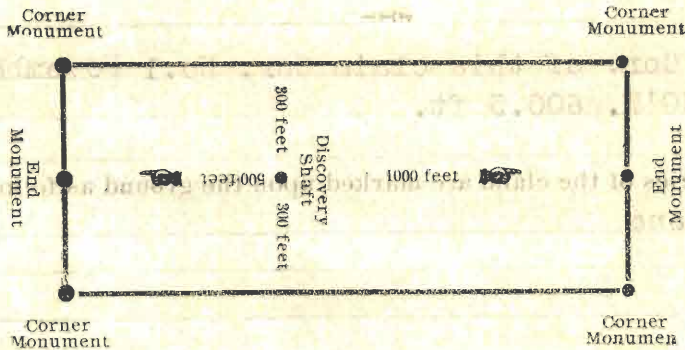

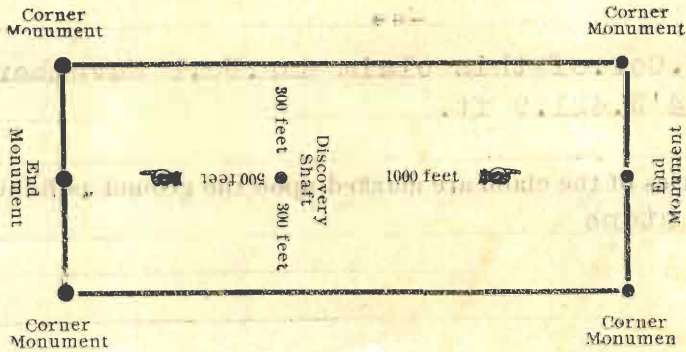
