NOTICE OF MINING LOCATION.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This Mining Claim, the name of which is the CASHIER No.3 Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by S. M. Franklin, the undersigned, on the First day of January 1898.

The length of this claim is 1500 feet, and I claim 800 feet in a Westerly direction and 700 feet in a Easterly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted, lengthwise of the claim, together with 300 feet in width of the surface grounds on each side of the center of said claim.

The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the Easterly to the Westerly. The claim is situated and located in the Owl Head Mining District, in Pinal County, in the Territory of Arizona, about 4 miles in a Easterly direction from Owls Head Buttes and about 2 miles Southerly from Chief Butte.




