INSTRUMENT,

This survey was made with a Gurley solar transit.The courses were deflected from the true meridian as determined by direct solar observations.The distances were measured with 100-ft.and 500-ft.steel tapes.

Report.

The discrepancy between these notes and the location notice of Arizona Belle lode is due to errors in the later.

The lode line of each location in this survey was run directly upon the ground and the several corners were established by means of offsets from the lode lines. The tie lines were run directly upon the ground.

Common improvement tunnel No.2 Arizona Belle lode is so located that by drifts, crosscuts and lateral drifts each location in this claim may be developed. From the mouth of this tunnel the surface ascends to the south-east, and descends for a few feet to the northwest, then ascends.
