ADJOINING CLAIMS

This survey conflicts on the north with the Ophir

Lode claim, unsurveyed, owned by the Congress Consolidated Gold Mines Co.

This survey is bounded on the south end line by Bull Dog Lode Sur. No. 3084, John C. Gillespie and Mrs. M. F. Sims, claimants.

There are no other adjoining claims.

INSTRUMENT

This survey was made with a Lietz Light Mountain transit - theodolite, No. 13-5929. The courses ~~were~~ were deflected from the true meridian, as determined by observations by the use of the Saegmuller Solar Attachment. The distances were measured with a 100 foot and 300 foot steel tape.

REPORT

The Southeast and southwest corners of the Ophir lode unsurveyed, are mounds of stone four foot base and four feet high.

Cor. No. 2 Niagara Lode Sur. No. 880, identical with Cor. No. 2 Excelsior Lode, Sur. No. 921, is a projecting boulder properly marked as described in the field notes.

U.S.M.M. No. 1 cannot be tied to, as it is under the waste dump of one of the shafts of the Congress Consolidated Gold Mines Co. This was determined from the calls in the official records of the adjoining claims which ~~were~~ were tied to this monument.

The 1/4 cor. between sections 23-24 is a mound of stone as described in the field notes for same, but I was unable to distinguish positively any markings on stones near by as called for in notes. This corner bears N. 89° - 55' E. 5286.4 ft. from the west 1/4 corner of Section 23, so it agrees exactly with the call for its true position, according to the official records of subdivision of public Lands.

The discrepancies found existing between the claim as marked by location monuments and as described in the location notices, are due to errors in the location notices
