This Mining Claim, the name of which is the LONE STAR Mining Claim, situate on lands belonging to the United States of America, and in which there are valuable mineral deposits, was entered upon and located for the purposes of exploration and purchase by THE CONSOLIDATED HOLDING AND TRUST COMPANY, a corporation, one-third (1/3), FRANK SNYDER, one-third (1/3), and JOHN C. GREENWAY, one-third (1/3), Citizens of the United States, the undersigned, on the 26th day of May, 1913.

The length of this claim is Fifteen Hundred feet and we claim Two Hundred and Eighty feet in a Northerly direction, and Twelve Hundred and Twenty feet in a Southerly direction from the center of the discovery shaft, at which this notice is posted; lengthwise of the claim, together with Three hundred feet in width of the surface grounds, on each side of the center of said claim. The general course of the lode deposit and premises is from the north to the south.

The claim is situated and located in the Pioneer Mining District, in Pinal County, in the State of Arizona, about Four miles in an easterly direction from Picket Post Butte, the most prominent natural object in this horizon, and about two miles south of the mouth of Queen Creek Canon.
